Emptying Oneself for the Others

"Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (NAS Phil. 2:5-8).

We have just returned from **the fourth annual medical-dental mission**. This year, we went to the remote parish of **St Michael Archangel in Calintaan, Mindoro Occidental**, one of the islands of the Philippines. The Missionaries of Jesus working there, Frs. Fred Pinuela and Efren "Wren" Reyes, prepared a very simple but warm welcome to the 47 participants coming from the USA, Canada, Australia and from the Philippines.



Because of time constraint (due to flight delay – thanks to Cebu Pacific), the Parish Pastoral Council decided to hold the Medical-Dental Mission in the main church – people from the different communities, especially the Mangyans from the mountains had to travel for several hours to reach the place. However, what struck me most was how the lowlanders gave priority to the Mangyans. Every now and then, we had to pull the latter out from the long queue so that they receive the services first because they needed to walk back to the mountains before dark. And it was okay to the lowlanders who





came first to give up their turns. Talk about the option for the last, the least and the lost.

We thank all the participants who came all the way from abroad – leaving behind their families (children and grandkids), days of work (income) and **comfort** zones. We are mostly grateful to the young local dentists from Manila and Baguio who dedicated some days with our brothers and sisters in Calintaan. Both groups gave up something in order to serve more than one thousand needy people.

We also thank you — our friends and benefactors who were not able to join us physically but who journeyed with us in spirit and helped us finance the said mission. They also gave up something in order to help us serve.

Saint Paul tells us, through the hymn cited above, that our Lord Jesus gave up also something in order to serve (Phil 2:5-8). But the hymn does not end here; verse 9 says: "For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name".

Friends and co-disciples of the Risen Lord, I urge you to continue giving up something important in order to share not only in the incarnation, mission, passion and death of our Lord but also in his resurrection. Continue journeying with the Missionaries of Jesus as friends and disciples. As Saint Paul tells us in the same letter, let us do this with joy.











Medical-Dental Mission Daily Journal



The Missionaries of Jesus Medical-Dental Mission in Calintaan, Mindoro Occidental, Philippines took place last February 20-23, 2015.

The group of 47 consisted of Missionaries of Jesus priests, friends, Lay Associates; nurses, dentists, doctors and dental hygienists who came from the USA (Los Angeles, San Diego Southern California area), Australia, Canada, Guatemala, and from the Philippines (Metro Manila and Baguio City).

Feb 20th - Friday. Calintaan, Mindoro - Here we come. Departure time, 6:05 a.m. Via Cebu Pacific Airlines, Manila to San Jose, Mindoro.





Be at the NAIA3 before 4:00 a.m. to give time allowance for check-in and security checks.

After the group checked-in, some were having breakfasts inside the NAIA3 airport while some couples were taking an early morning nap on the steel benches on Gate 20, while some were busy taking group pictures with their smart phones, iPad and iPhones. The flight was delayed for more than three hours. Cebu Pacific did not realize that it took away three important hours from the people of Calintaan.

Upon arrival at the San Jose, Mindoro Airport, we saw a big welcome banner and a group of local MJ Priests, Staffs and volunteers headed by **MJ Fathers Fred Pinuela and Efren "Wren" Reyes**. A green bus transported us to Calintaan. A welcome breakfast was served and T-Shirts

The place of our accommodation was like a hidden paradise with beautiful views of the beaches – an ideal place for weekend retreats.

12:00 Noon. The Medical-Dental Mission began at the St Michael the Archangel Parish Church. **Bro. Felix, MJ** and companions led the welcome liturgy followed by a short welcome speech and the presentation of the MJ Associates and local volunteers.





Hundreds of people lined up on the Side Patio of the Church for registration. After several minutes, the inside of St Michael Parish Church would look like a Medical Center assembly line:

- Nurses taking Blood Pressure of patients
- Skin testing for allergy
- Dental Hygienists teeth cleaning and or filling.
- Dental Extraction
- Medical consultation
- Sterilizing and bleaching dental instruments
- Pharmacy table medicine and prescriptions dispensation.





At the end of the day, about 500 parishioners received medical and dental services. Medicines, vitamins, prescriptions and some gifts for children were distributed.

8:00 a.m. to St Michael Parish Church

9:00 a.m. Morning Prayer and then Work

This time people from other Barangays came in droves for early registration including the Mangyans - some of them from the Tao-Buid tribes who brought their families, children, siblings and neighbors. They walked down from the mountains to avail of the Medical-Dental services. The Registration Staff could tell that these Mangyans live a frugal and simple life by the way they dressed yet they showed warm and loving attitudes. They ate whatever food served to them. They waited for the rest of their group to complete dental services before going up to the mountains. They went back home with appropriate medicines and vitamins

The parish staff and volunteers served lunch and snacks to the medical and dental team at St Michael Rectory.

At the end of the second day, more than 700 people including Mangyans received services, medicines and vitamins.
